#### CONDITION PRIOR TO TREATMENT

The object was coated in layers of dirt and dust, this was particularly visible in recesses and fixing holes. Small areas of exposed and friable plaster along with warn areas of paint were visible on the front side.

The object number was scratched into the centre of the front side; this had penetrated through the paint layer into the plaster.

#### **TREATMENT**

#### Cleaning and a fill:

All surfaces were given a brush clean with a pony hair brush and vacuum extraction. The front side was then cleaned with cotton saliva swabs.

One fill (pictured below) located to the proper left of the top side. The rest of the object was given no more than a brush and saliva swab clean - images of these areas have not been included.

## Consolidation and toning:

Friable areas of plaster on front side were consolidated with Primal B60A (8%) and then toned in with matte acrylic paint to merge with the surrounding areas.

The object number scratched into the centre of the front side was deemed disfiguring. Once cleaned this area was cosolidated with Primal B60A (8%) where necessary, and toned in with matte acrylic paint to match the surrounding area.
